## The European Union opens borders after 83 days closure due to COVID-19 confinement

The European Union's economy is expected to shrink by 7.4 percent in 2020, while an economic recovery is anticipated in 2021. Greece and Italy are set to be the worst affected economies, seeing GDP decline by 9.7 and 9.5 respectively, while Poland is forecast to shrink by 4.3 percent and shrink the least in 2020.

Will these projections be mitigated by the long-term EU budget 2021-2027 and a Recovery Plan to respond to the COVID-19?

The United Nations Human Rights Council resumes its 43<sup>rd</sup> session, after having been suspended on March 13 due to COVID-19 pandemic. The resumed session discusses topics ranging from human rights mechanisms to technical assistance and capacity building in the human rights field. Following a request made by Burkina Faso on behalf of the African Group, the Council decided to hold an urgent debate on the current racially inspired human rights violations, systemic racism, police brutality and the violence against peaceful protests.

## Commissioner Phil Hogan launches review of the European Union trade policy

The European Commission launches a major review of the European Union's trade policy, including a public consultation seeking input from the European Parliament, Member States, stakeholders and civil society. The Commission's objective is to build a consensus around a fresh medium-term direction for EU trade policy, responding to a variety of new global challenges and considering the lessons learned from the coronavirus crisis.
